
What does good attendance look like?

Minsthorpe Community College's attendance target is 96%. The bar chart below shows attendance percentages as 'days off' each year. To achieve the target of 96% attendance, students should aim to have no more than 8 days absence per year.



Persistent absence, often called PA, is 90% attendance or less (more than 19 days off per year). This impacts negatively on learning and progress.

The following chart shows the clear impact of attendance on students' GCSE results in Year 11 at Minsthorpe Community College last year. The better your attendance, the higher your GCSE grades!



What is the difference between authorised and unauthorised absence?

Minsthorpe Community College follows the Department for Education (DfE) Guidance regarding authorised and unauthorised absence.

Authorised absence

We understand that some absences are unavoidable. This is called authorised absence and includes:

- Genuine illness, when a student is too ill to come to school
- Specialist medical and dental appointments
- · Religious observances
- Family bereavement

These absences need to be kept to a minimum. Written evidence of extended illness and medical appointments will be requested.

Please contact the Attendance Team via School Gateway or by emailing **enquiries@minsthorpe.cc** if your child is unavoidably absent. Please give a clear reason and **contact us on each day of absence**. The Attendance Team will follow up with phone calls and/or home visits, as appropriate.

Unauthorised absence

Unfortunately, some absences are **not** essential or reasonable. This is called unauthorised absence and includes:

- Unexplained absence
- Day trips, family outings or long weekends
- Problems with uniform or hair styles
- Routine medical and dental appointments (which must be taken after College)
- Taking a full day off for a short appointment
- Birthdays
- Term-time holidays
- Arriving after 9:05am
 (30 minutes after the register has closed)

Punctuality

Punctuality is an essential life skill which we want our students to establish. Late arrivals are disruptive to the learning of everyone within the classroom.

We ask you to ensure that your child arrives to school on time. We will contact you if your child is persistently late.

8:25am - Students move to P&A Time

8:30am - Gate Closes (Students Late)

8:35am – Register taken

9:05am – Register closed (unauthorised absence)





Holidays during Term-Time

Any holidays taken during term-time will be **unauthorised**. Minsthorpe Community College informs Wakefield Local Authority (LA) of term-time holidays of 5 days or more and the LA issues Penalty Notices (fines).

Taking holidays during term-time means that students miss out on learning which they will need to catch up on when they return to school.

Leave of Absence

Only 'exceptional circumstances' warrant a leave of absence. A Leave of Absence Form must be completed by the parent/carer and written evidence must be provided. The Principals will consider each application individually.


What happens if attendance drops below 90%?

The DfE classes attendance of below 90% as **persistent absence**.

Minsthorpe Community College is required to follow the statutory DfE Guidance 'Working together to improve attendance' which includes the legal process outlined below. This process can lead to prosecution for absence. A penalty notice of £80 may be issued by Wakefield Local Authority as an alternative to prosecution. This will rise to £160 if not paid within 21 days.

We want to work with parents/carers to avoid persistent absence and to improve their child's attendance. The flowchart below shows the process we follow:
