Please clearly explain the symptoms your child has, when the symptoms started, and when you expect your child to be well enough to return to College.

The college has a legal obligation to record absences. We must determine whether absences are authorised or unauthorised. Unauthorised absences are detrimental to a child's progress in school and can result in fixed penalty notices being issued.
