

The age of consent for sex; England and Wales

The age of consent to any form of sexual activity is 16 for both men and women. The age of consent is the same regardless of the gender or sexual orientation of a person and whether the sexual activity is between people of the same or different gender.

It is an offence for anyone to have any sexual activity with a person under the age of 16. However, Home Office guidance [1] is clear that there is no intention to prosecute teenagers under the age of 16 where both mutually agree and where they are of a similar age.

It is an offence for a person aged 18 or over to have any sexual activity with a person under the age of 18 if the older person holds a position of trust (for example a teacher or social worker) as such sexual activity is an abuse of the position of trust.


The Sexual Offences Act 2003 provides specific legal protection for children aged 12 and under who cannot legally give their consent to any form of sexual activity. There is a maximum sentence of life imprisonment for rape, assault by penetration, and causing or inciting a child to engage in sexual activity.



Pornography and the law

You can legally buy porn magazines and videos at 18 All regulated porn websites try to prevent under 18's from accessing them.



Certain types of porn are illegal – even for an adult to be in procession of. These are called 'extreme pornographic images'

It is illegal for a person under 18 to send explicit images or films of themselves, or of another young person.

Studies have shown that when young people are exposed to sexually explicit material they are at a higher risk of;

- Unrealistic attitudes about sex and consent
- Negative attitudes towards roles and identities in relationships
- More casual attitude to sex
- Unrealistic expectations of body image and performance.



What is Child Sexual Exploitation?

- Child sexual exploitation is a form of child abuse
- Someone under the age of 18 is persuaded or manipulated (tricked) into sexual activity.

Sometimes abusers use violence and intimidation to frighten or force a child or young person, making them feel as if they have no choice.


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What is grooming?

- Being given things, like gifts, drugs, money, status and affection, in exchange for performing sexual activities.
- Children and young people are often tricked into believing they're in a loving and consensual relationship
 - Anybody can be a perpetrator of CSE, no matter their age, gender or race.
 - The relationship could be framed as friendship, someone to look up to or romantic.
 - Children and young people who are exploited may also be used to 'find' or coerce others to join groups.





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
