








Sexual harassment definition

Sexual Harassment is unwanted behaviour of a sexual nature (e.g. something sexual or related to your gender) which does any of the following:

- Violates your dignity (e.g. makes you feel disrespected)
- Makes you feel intimidated, degraded or humiliated
- Creates a hostile or offensive environment
- Sexual harassment can happen online and in person



How do you think sexual harassment should be addressed and what can we do to tackle these issues?

In groups create an agenda for change, containing steps you think are essential to reduce behaviours of sexual harassment in society. "I was in yr 8 at the time and a boy in my year group grabbed my bum and my breast and he laughed it off I ran to the toilet and cried my eyes out when I told them what happened they laughed and told me it was normal I thought that it was okay and it happened to everyone and I only released how messed up it was when I was in yr10 now I have left school but I still struggle to deal with it and is very uncomfortable with any boys hugging me or being around me I never told my mum"

"I was sexually harassed at my school. I told my teachers, but they did nothing. Absolutely nothing." "A girl repeatedly grabbed my bum around school and in class once shoved her hands down my pants and squeezed my balls whilst her friends laughed."

"It was in P.E, and we were lining up. There was this boy behind me, and he slid his hand in my underwear and started feeling my bum, he wouldn't stop and the teachers weren't anywhere near us. It's been 11 years, and I don't think I can ever forget it."

"Someone photoshopped my face onto a nude image and told people at school it was me. People tried to start sexual encounters with me and yelled crude things at me when I would walk home"

"A boy in my year He sits next to me in my math class He looks at me, so creepy He'll get closer and rub his hand up my inner thigh It makes me so uncomfortable, but I don't know who to tell"



Chloe is determined to get good GCSE results. She wants to go to Uni and aspires to be a pharmacist. She tries to keep her head down in school, but this makes her a target for bullying. She's always told to stop being frigid and get a life.

- One day, on the way home from school some of her classmates appear behind her and start shouting abuse.
- Chloe starts to walk faster but they grab Chloe's bag and pull her back.
- They hold Chloe to the wall; they lift her shirt and take pictures of her then go through her bag and dump her stuff out.
- When Chloe starts to cry, they tell her she needs to lighten up and learn to take a joke its only banter.
- Chloe no longer walks home that way. She takes a longer route to avoid the group however when she sees them in school her heart pounds and she panics.

SCENARIO 2



Ryan has received a pornographic video through WhatsApp from his classmate Will. Ryan really doesn't feel comfortable watching it, so he deletes it. Pretending to have watched it Ryan replies to Will: 'wow that was mental. She was well fit'. He's worried if he doesn't, Will might say he's 'gay' or 'soft' and his mates will have a dig at him too. He's seen it happen to other boys in their friendship group, it seems like everyone watches them and if you don't like it then there's something wrong with you. As they get older and get into relationships, the videos and pictures become more frequent and explicit. Some videos have girls they go to school with in them. Ryan hates the fact that the lads all laugh and compare their bodies, but he feels that he can't say anything, so he pretends to laugh along.

Jamie has recently come out on social media as a gay man. He feels pride in his sexuality and his identity and didn't want to hide his true self any longer. However, this makes him a target for some of the males in his year, specifically in P.E.

Some boys have refused to get changed in the same room, accusing him of looking at them inappropriately. Others flash Jamie during changing time stating they that he fancies them. Two males have smacked Jamie's bum as he's been changing, and one even reached into Jamie's shorts and groped him.

Jamie has spoken with a trusted adult about this behaviour and was told that some of the boys might act this way because they feel uncomfortable while others want him to feel like 'one of the boys' still and assures him the behaviour will die down when they are used to Jamie's news.



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HELP AND SUPPORT

The pastoral team in school, a trusted adult, the school nurse, anyone you feel comfortable to talk to.

If you have any concerns that someone you know may be a victim of Child Sexual Exploitation report it to the Police by calling 101 or you can call Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111. In an emergency always dial 999

If you visit a spectrum clinic the nurses and doctors can also speak to you about unhealthy relationships and consent
