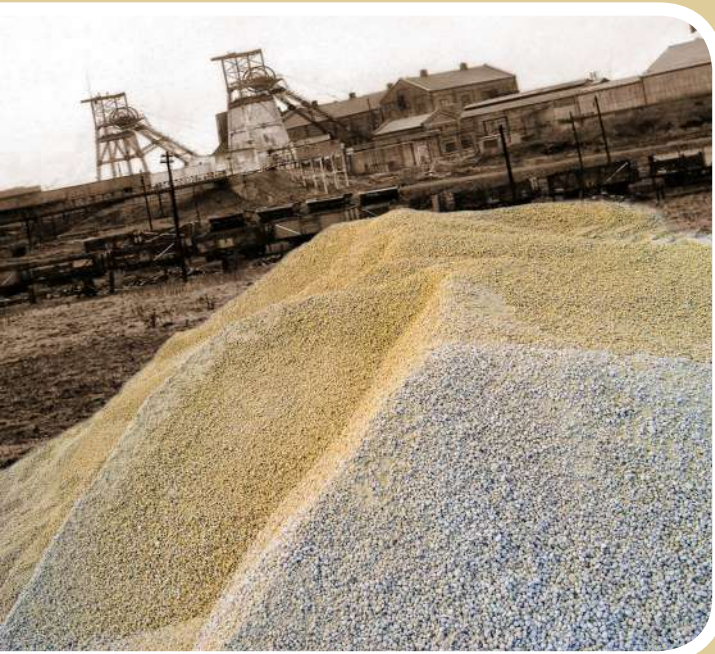


## Wakefield College Tournament Winners – Girls Rugby Team

Their plan is to set up a uniform donation service which will then allow the students to start with their long term plan of running a weekly foodbank for referrals from the community. Over the next few weeks they will be renovating the Portakabin in conjunction with Wickes and Volunteer It Yourself as well as collecting uniform donations. The students are gaining a large amount of employability skills from the project.

Out Parade on the 12th April 2019, presenting to their family members what they had learned. The group performed a complex drill sequence in a mock up situation where they rescued "casualties", from

different scenarios. To close the session Chief Fire Office John Roberts presented each person with a certificate of achievement. Well done to them all.

## History Visit to Paris

In the Spring-bank half term holidays A Level History students Millie Andrews and Abbie Stringer visited key locations in Paris that are significant to their studies on 'Revolutionary France 1774 – 1815'. They managed to pack loads into the two days including the lavish Palace of Versailles, the home of Louis XVI before the Parisian mobs ousted him and his wife Marie Antoinette. They also saw the beginnings of the restoration project to Notre Dame (where Napoleon was crowned Emperor in 1804), along with the Louvre Museum which houses many of his art acquisitions, seized from Italy and Egypt during his military campaigns. The views from the top of Arc de Triomphe were magnificent. The tour of Paris finished with a little chill on the grass of the Champ de Mars whilst admiring the most famous landmark of them all – the Eiffel Tower. The students thoroughly enjoyed their experiences and were a credit to themselves, their families and the college.

This year a successful STEM club has been established. Students have investigated formulating moisturisers, slime, bath bombs and gloop, engineered bridges, towers, lifts and cable cars. KS3 students have taken part in engineering activities with Shell Engineers, making, optimising then racing cars. We were also fortunate enough to have experienced the engineering skills from the RAF STEM team. KS4 students have attended the Universities of Leeds, York and Huddersfield touring the departments of Engineering, Medicine, Maths and Applied Science. They also tested substances in an analytical chemistry laboratory as well as undertaking field research at the National Coal Mining Museum. 180 year 9 students participated in robot wars in the science department. KS5 students have attended Universities to discover career pathways available through STEM as well as undertaking an organic chemistry practical workshop to enhance their technical skills.
