
WELL DONE, FREDDIE



The students listened to a talk and then took part in a practical experiment where they tested meat products with antibodies and antigens. They then had a tour of the kitchens and discussions on nutrition courses and then how to apply in terms of UCAS and personal statement- it was amazing and the students really relished in discussions about jobs and careers and higher education in general- lots of them have made the decision to go to university and study nutrition from this which is amazing. Three out of five Year 13s are all applying to study nutrition at Sheffield.
















YEAR 8 HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL






SCIENCE CLUB















In Science Club this year, students from Year 7 and 8 have gathered after school to explore and discover the world around them through the lenses of Physics, Biology and Chemistry. From the magnetic poles of the Earth to the heart of Daphnia (microscopic water fleas), students have challenged themselves and tried to answer big questions; Could we actually bring dinosaurs back to life? Should we do it? How are acids and alkalis used in everyday life? Is it ethical to use live specimens for scientific investigations? These students have come together and used a handson approach to answer these questions using scientific models - just like real-world scientists!

Throughout November, Science hosted several ABM J.E.E.P days helping to promote engineering as a career choice and help tackle the skills gap faced by the industry. Students spent three days working on a variety of practical experiences, problem solving activities and designing their own sustainable venture. They interviewed the CEO of ABM, who commented that some of the questions she received from our Year 7 cohort were the best she had ever heard! The presentations and poster produced during the third session were outstanding. Well done Year 7!



EXAM PREPARATIONS BEGIN

On Thursday morning, a group of Year 11 students received a presentation from SENDIASS about how to access support should they need to. Anna from WESAIL spoke about the services available to our young people in Wakefield, the range of support that is on offer and how to access this. The Year 11 students responded well to Anna's questions around SEND and asked important questions with regards to their own access arrangements, showing a real sense of responsibility towards their exams, as well as their normal way of working in the classroom.



TRAINING TO TEACH



The first term of our teacher training has been an incredible experience. As trainees on the YTCA SCITT, we observe and teach alongside experienced practitioners and we read a variety of pedagogy to improve our teaching practice. Our Hub Days at Minsthorpe are spent discussing tried and tested teaching theory as well as learning new, innovative approaches. In the recent 'Active Approaches' session, we explored how movement improves understanding through the lens of Shakespearean texts. We recited, repeated and performed scenes from Hamlet, Macbeth and Othello, and I was surprised by how the active approaches made these texts much more accessible. We can't wait to implement some of these strategies in class!

MINSTHORPE CONCERT

We were delighted to play to a live audience at the Christmas Music Concert. It had been 722 days since the last live performance in the Main Hall, but it was well worth the wait. The capacity crowd were entertained by singers, drummers and instrumentalists of the highest standard. Another evening to remember!
